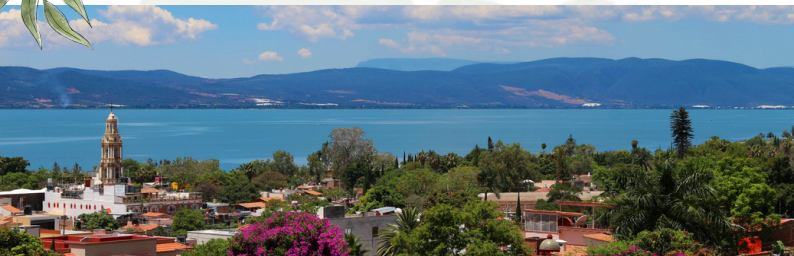


AJIJIC / CHAPALA

THINGS TO SEE & DO

Climate

Ajjic enjoys a mild and pleasant climate throughout the year, with many sunny days. For late February, temperatures are typically around:

Daytime: 24 – 28 °C

Sunset: 18 – 22 °C

Nighttime: 12 – 16 °C

Days are usually sunny and warm, while evenings can feel cooler. We recommend bringing: light clothing for the day, and a light jacket or sweater for the evening.

Safety

Ajjic is considered a very calm and safe town, with a large international community.

General recommendations:

- Use common sense as you would in any destination.
- Avoid poorly lit streets late at night.
- Use authorized taxis or Uber when needed.

Getting There

Ajjic is located approximately 40 minutes from Guadalajara International Airport (GDL). Transportation options include: Uber or airport taxi, private transportation.

Currency

The currency in Mexico is the Mexican peso (MXN).

Most restaurants, hotels, and shops accept credit cards, but it is still useful to carry some cash for taxis, small shops, or local markets.

Tipping

Tipping is customary in Mexico: 10-15% is standard in restaurants.

Plug Adapters

Mexico uses Type A and B plugs (the same as in the United States) with 127 V.

Guests traveling from Europe will need a plug adapter.

Drinking Water

It is recommended to drink bottled water. Restaurants and hotels typically use filtered water when preparing food and beverages.
