Puerto Vallarta & Riviera Nayarit

If you would like to visit the beach after the wedding, Puerto Vallarta is an excellent option. It is only a 1-hour flight from Guadalajara or approximately 4-5 hours by car. Puerto Vallarta combines beautiful beaches, mountains, great food, and lively nightlife.

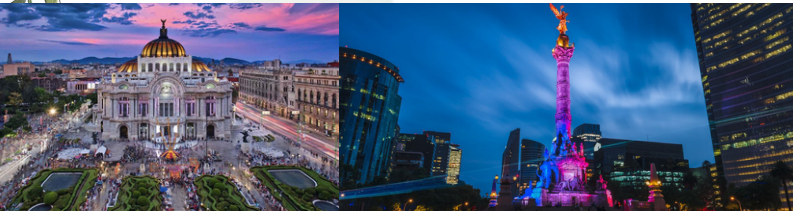

Recommended places in the area:

- Punta Mita: Luxury resorts and spectacular beaches.
- San Pancho (San Francisco): A small bohemian town with a relaxed atmosphere.
- Sayulita: A very popular surf town with cafés and restaurants.

México City (CDMX)

Mexico's capital is one of the most fascinating cities in Latin America, with a unique mix of history, art, gastronomy, and contemporary culture.

Here you will find world-class museums, historic architecture, vibrant neighborhoods full of cafés and restaurants, and one of the most exciting culinary scenes in the world.

Must-see places:

- Historic Center (Zócalo, Cathedral, National Palace, and the Palace of Fine Arts)
- National Museum of Anthropology: One of the most important museums in the world dedicated to pre-Hispanic cultures.
- Chapultepec Park & Castle: One of the largest urban parks in the world.
- Roma & Condesa: Trendy neighborhoods with cafés, restaurants, and nightlife.
- Teotihuacán Pyramids: Located about 1 hour from the city. One of the most impressive archaeological sites in Mexico, home to the famous Pyramids of the Sun and the Moon.
- Coyoacán: A charming historic neighborhood full of plazas, cafés, and traditional markets. It is also home to the famous Frida Kahlo Museum (Casa Azul).
- Xochimilco: A unique place where you can navigate the ancient canals of the city on colorful trajineras while enjoying food, music, and drinks.



La Paz (Baja California Sur)

One of the favorite destinations for travelers visiting Mexico. La Paz offers spectacular beaches, turquoise waters, and stunning nature.

Must-see places:

- Balandra Beach
- Espiritu Santo Island
- Swimming with whale sharks

It is a perfect destination for those looking for peaceful beaches and nature.

Puerto Escondido (Oaxaca)

An incredible destination on Mexico's Pacific coast.

Puerto Escondido is famous for spectacular beaches, a relaxed atmosphere, and excellent surf spots.

Recommended places:

- Playa Zicatela

Oaxaca

Mérida & Península de Yucatán

Mérida is an elegant colonial city with a rich cultural heritage.

From Mérida you can explore:

- Chichén Itzá (one of the Seven Wonders of the Modern World)
- Cenotes (natural underground swimming pools)
- Uxmal and other Mayan archaeological sites

The region is also famous for its Yucatecan cuisine.





Riviera Maya (Cancún, Tulum, Playa del Carmen)

Here you will find white sand beaches, turquoise water, cenotes, and Mayan ruins by the sea.

Recommended places:

- Tulum: Mayan ruins overlooking the sea, boutique hotels, and nightlife.
- Playa del Carmen: A lively coastal town with many restaurants and activities.
- Cozumel: One of the best places in the world for scuba diving.
- Isla Mujeres: A small tropical island with spectacular beaches.

San Miguel de Allende

One of the most beautiful colonial cities in Mexico.

San Miguel de Allende is famous for its spectacular colonial architecture, art galleries, restaurants, cafés, and vibrant cultural atmosphere.

It is a very popular destination among international travelers.





Holbox

A small island in the Mexican Caribbean known for its relaxed atmosphere and stunning natural beauty.

Here you will find:

- peaceful beaches
- sandy streets with no cars
- beautiful sunsets

During certain seasons it is also possible to swim with whale sharks, a truly unique experience.

Climate

The climate in Mexico varies depending on the region:

- Pacific Coast: warm and tropical
- Yucatán Peninsula: warm and humid
- Mexico City: mild climate

In general we recommend bringing:

- light clothing
- sunscreen
- a light jacket

Safety

Mexico is a large country and, as with any destination, some regions are safer than others. The tourist destinations mentioned in this guide receive millions of visitors every year and are generally safe for travelers.

However, we recommend avoiding travel to certain regions such as: Michoacán, Guanajuato, Sinaloa, and Tamaulipas.

General recommendations:

- Use Uber or reliable transportation
- Stay within tourist areas
- Avoid driving at night on remote highways
- Avoid walking at night in poorly lit areas

Getting Around Mexico

Mexico has an excellent network of domestic flights, which are the fastest way to travel between cities. The main airlines include:

- Aeroméxico
- Volaris
- Viva Aerobus

Flights within the country usually take between 1 and 3 hours, depending on the destination.
